Decisional Control: The freedom to take decisions (any kind of decision). Freedom of education, sexual choice, profession, relationship with anyone. There will be no interference.

Communicational Control: You have full control upon communications. I can talk to my father anything I want.

Intellectual Control: Your control upon your thoughts, beliefs, ideas, opinions etc.

Informational Control: Information about your personal data. That is in complete control. Your age, place of birth etc.

Cases Related to Privacy

In a decided case ^[1] a majority of eight judge constitution bench held that right to privacy was not a central right under the Indian Constitution and furthermore held that search and seizure is must for the protection. Also expressed that search and seizure process is transitory obstruction for which legal acknowledgement was superfluous.

The Supreme Court ruled ^[2] that domiciliary night visits were against Article 21 of the Indian Constitution and a person's individual freedom in a case where police monitoring was under scrutiny due to a violation of the right to protection. As a result, the court has determined that the right to protection is a limited right that should be taken into account on a case-by-case basis rather than an absolute right.

In a decided case^[3] an auto driver, who was condemned to death for a situation of homicide, unveiled in his life account his relations for certain open authorities. The Supreme Court held that distribution of any data without the assent of the individual would be infringement of Article 21. The just exemption is the point at which the data depends on freely available reports. Supreme Court further said – a resident has a privilege to shield the protection of his own, his family, marriage, multiplication, parenthood, childbearing and instruction among different issues.

Justice Khanna dissented in the matter of Additional District Magistrate Jabalpur v. Shivkant Shukla. He contends that a person's inherent right to life and personal freedom is their right to exist. He has a right to life and personal freedom just by virtue of his being. The Constitution protects and ensures that right, not that life itself. Life and individual freedom are protected both before and after the constitution goes into effect. It was granted the status of a basic right, meaning the constitution would defend and preserve it. Every natural person has control over his or her mind and body, and that right to privacy cannot be violated.
